Notice of Intent to Revoke 2026 Type I Bingo License

- A. For purposes of this Notice: the terms “you” or “your” shall refer to the organization “Harry Clevenger Scholarship Foundation” and specific terms contained herein shall have the same meaning as defined and set forth in the provisions of Chapter 2915 of the Revised Code and Agency 109:1 of the Administrative Code.
- B. The Ohio Attorney General’s Office hereby informs you that it intends to revoke your 2026 Type I Bingo License (“Type I License”) based on the following circumstances:
 - 1. On February 4, 2026, you submitted an application for a Type I Bingo License.
 - 2. You identified the address of “505 South Main St[reet], Springboro, OH 45066” as the location where you intended to conduct Type I bingo.
 - 3. On February 20, 2026, the Attorney General’s Office issued to you a Type I Bingo License for you to conduct that type of bingo at 505 South Main Street, Springboro, OH 45066 on Tuesdays from 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. for thirty-two weeks.
 - 4. 505 South Main Street, Springboro, OH 45066 is the address where Heather’s Cafe is located.
 - 5. Heather’s Cafe advertises your bingo sessions on its Facebook page.
 - 7. Heather’s Cafe provides bingo game operators, concessions or concession operators, and/or other types of services during your bingo sessions.
- D. In view of the foregoing, the Attorney General’s Office intends to revoke your Type I Bingo License based on the following reasons:
 - 1. Revised Code Section 2915.07 prohibits any “person, except a charitable organization that has obtained a license pursuant to section 2915.08 of the Revised Code,” from conducting or advertising bingo. In violation of this provision, you allowed Heather’s Cafe to advertise your bingo sessions on its Facebook page.
 - 2. Revised Code Section 2915.09(B)(1) prohibits the lessor of premises where a charitable organization conducts Type I bingo from providing the charitable

organization “bingo game operators, security personnel, concessions or concession operators, bingo supplies, or any other type of service.” In violation of this provision, you allowed Heather’s Cafe to provide bingo game operators, concessions or concession operators, and/or other types of service during your Type I bingo sessions.

3. Revised Code Section 2915.08(F)(2)(e) authorizes the Attorney General to deny a bingo license if it “has good cause to believe that the organization will not conduct bingo in accordance with sections [2915.07](#) to [2915.15](#) of the Revised Code or with any rule adopted by the attorney general pursuant to this chapter.” In view of the foregoing circumstances, the Attorney General has good cause to believe that you will not conduct bingo in accordance with sections [2915.07](#) to [2915.15](#) of the Revised Code or with any rule it has adopted.

Pursuant to Section 119.07 of the Revised Code, you are entitled to a hearing on this matter if you timely request one. If you wish to request a hearing, the Attorney General’s Office must receive the request from you within 30 days of the date you are served with this notice. In the event you timely request a hearing, you may appear in person and represent yourself or be represented by an attorney that is permitted to practice law in the State of Ohio.* At the hearing, you may present evidence and examine witnesses appearing for and against you. In lieu of attending the hearing, you may also present your position, arguments, or contentions in writing. At all times, you have the burden of demonstrating to the attorney general, by clear and convincing evidence, that you are eligible, qualified, and suitable for licensure under Chapter 2915 of the Revised Code and Agency 109:1 of the Administrative Code.

***Be advised that, under Ohio law, corporations must be represented by an attorney authorized to practice law in this State and that individuals not so authorized may not appear and represent those entities. If you have any questions regarding your status, you should contact an attorney for further guidance.**
