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Notice of Intent to Revoke and Opportunity for Hearing

For purposes of this Notice, the terms “you” or “your” shall refer to the organization “Huber Heights Athletic Foundation”.

The Ohio Attorney General’s Office hereby informs you that it intends to revoke your 2026 Type I, II, and III Paper Instant Bingo License for the following reasons:

1. Ohio Revised Code Section (ORC) 2915.09(D)(1) prohibits any charitable organization from providing a bingo game operator “any commission, wage, salary, reward, tip, donation, gratuity, or other form of compensation, directly or indirectly, regardless of the source, for conducting bingo or providing other work or labor at the site of bingo during a bingo session.”

Pursuant to ORC 2915.01(Q) a bingo game operator is “any person, except security personnel, who performs work or labor at the site of bingo, including, but not limited to, collecting money from participants, handing out bingo cards or sheets or objects to cover spaces on bingo cards or sheets, selecting from a receptacle the objects that contain the combination of letters and numbers that appear on bingo cards or sheets, calling out the combinations of letters and numbers, distributing prizes, selling or redeeming instant bingo tickets or cards, selling or redeeming electronic instant bingo tickets, credits, or vouchers, accessing an electronic instant bingo system other than as a participant, supervising the operation of a punch board, selling raffle tickets, selecting raffle tickets from a receptacle and announcing the winning numbers in a raffle, and preparing, selling, and serving food or beverages. "Bingo game operator" does not include a person who is installing, maintaining, updating, or repairing an electronic instant bingo system.”

Your organization is violating this section by compensating bingo game operators (volunteers) through educational credits that possess a designated monetary value and function as a form of compensation. These credits may be redeemed for free bingo play, payment of school-related activity costs, funding of further educational fees, or applied toward other expenses requested by the volunteer.

2. ORC 2915.09(D)(2) prohibits any charitable organization from providing “a bingo game operator any commission, wage, salary, reward, tip, donation, gratuity, or other form of compensation, directly or indirectly, regardless of the source, for conducting instant bingo, electronic instant bingo, or both other than at a bingo session at the site of instant bingo, electronic instant bingo, or both other than at a bingo session.”

Your organization is violating this section by compensating bingo game operators (volunteers) through educational credits that possess a designated monetary value and function as a form of compensation. These credits may be redeemed for free bingo play, payment of school-related activity costs, funding of further educational fees, or applied toward other expenses requested by the volunteer.

3. O.R.C. 2915.08(F)(2)(e) authorizes the Attorney General to deny a bingo license if it “has **good cause** to believe that the organization will not conduct bingo in accordance with sections 2915.07 to 2915.15 of the Revised Code or with any rule adopted by the attorney general pursuant to this chapter.”

In view of the foregoing circumstances, the Attorney General has good cause to believe that you will not conduct bingo in accordance with sections 2915.07 to 2915.15 of the Revised Code or any rule adopted thereunder.

Pursuant to Section 119.07 of the O.R.C., you are entitled to a hearing on this matter if you timely request one. If you wish to request a hearing, the Attorney General’s Office must receive the request from you within 30 days of the date of the mailing of this notice. In the event there is a timely request for a hearing, you may appear in person and represent yourself or be represented by an attorney that is permitted to practice law in the State of Ohio.* At the hearing, you may present evidence and examine witnesses appearing for and against you. In lieu of attending the hearing, you may also present your position, arguments, or contentions in writing.

***Be advised that, under Ohio law, corporations must be represented by an attorney authorized to practice law in this State and that individuals not so authorized may not appear and represent those entities. If you have any questions regarding your status, you should contact an attorney for further guidance.**
