**Notice of Intent to Reject and Deny the Application for a
2026 Type I, II and III Paper and Electronic Instant Bingo License**

For purposes of this Notice, the terms “you” or “your” shall refer to the organization Tiffin Lodge No. 846, Loyal Order of Moose or “LOOM #846”.

The Ohio Attorney General’s Office hereby informs you that it intends to reject and deny your 2026 Type I, II, and III Paper and Electronic Instant Bingo License Application for the following reasons:

1. Ohio Revised Code Section (ORC) 2915.101(A)(1) requires Veterans and Fraternal to distribute a percentage of the net profit from the proceeds of the sale of electronic instant bingo to an organization described in ORC 2915.01(V)(1).

In violation of ORC 2915.101(A)(1), you have underpaid your designated charities by \$64,787.40 in 2025, \$46,634.59 in 2024 and \$63,617.16 in 2023.

2. ORC 2915.08(F)(2)(b) authorizes the Attorney General to refuse to grant a license to an organization that “makes or has made an incorrect or false statement that is material to the granting of the license in an application filed under this section.”

In violation of ORC 2915.08(F)(2)(b) for the last three years your organization has filed a bingo application attesting that your yearly charitable distributions have been paid in full. This misrepresentation caused the Attorney General to issue a bingo license in 2024, 2025 and a temporary permit for 2026.

3. Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) 109:1-5-14 requires Veterans and Fraternal organizations that conduct electronic instant bingo to file a quarterly report with the Attorney General’s Office.

In violation of OAC 109:1-5-14, you failed to file complete and timely reports for Quarters 1-4 of 2023-2025. Approximately thirty (30) days prior to the Quarterly Report due dates the Attorney General's Office sent a reminder email to your organization.

4. ORC 2915.08(F)(2)(e) authorizes the Attorney General to deny a bingo license if it "has good cause to believe that the organization will not conduct bingo in accordance with sections 2915.07 to 2915.15 of the Revised Code or with any rule adopted by the attorney general pursuant to this chapter."

In 2023 your organization filed a police report alleging a former administrator misappropriated over \$64,000. There have been issues surrounding your liquor license and IRS tax exempt status in the past three years. LOOM #846 has indicated that, since 2023, funds that should have been used for charitable distributions were instead used to support the organization's operations. Considering all the above-mentioned deficiencies, the Attorney General does not believe the organization will adhere to the applicable laws governing the lawful conduct of bingo in the future.

Pursuant to Section 119.07 of the Revised Code, you are entitled to a hearing on this matter if you timely request one. If you wish to request a hearing, the Attorney General's Office must receive the request from you within 30 days of the date you are served with this notice. In the event you timely request a hearing, you may appear in person and represent yourself or be represented by an attorney that is permitted to practice law in the State of Ohio.* At the hearing, you may present evidence and examine witnesses appearing for and against you. In lieu of attending the hearing, you may also present your position, arguments, or contentions in writing. At all times, you have the burden of demonstrating to the attorney general, by clear and convincing evidence, that you are eligible, qualified, and suitable for licensure under Chapter 2915 of the Revised Code and Agency 109:1 of the Administrative Code.

***Be advised that, under Ohio law, corporations must be represented by an attorney authorized to practice law in this State and that individuals not so authorized may not appear and represent those entities. If you have any questions regarding your status, you should contact an attorney for further guidance.**
